

Cashmere Tennis Club Membership Definitions



Education facilities: Recognised providers include secondary schools, universities, polytechnics, wānanga, private training establishments registered with NZQA, institutes of technology operating within the New Zealand Qualifications Framework. While homeschooling is a legitimate educational pathway, it may not involve enrolment in a recognised institution. Such members under the age of 19 may qualify for a junior membership. There is no upper age limit for student membership eligibility.

Eligibility must be verified annually at renewal by presentation of a current student identification card, a current enrolment confirmation letter, or equivalent documentation issued by the education provider.

Household: Members of a household membership are expected to share the primary residential address as a unified economic unit, meaning they share joint or primary financial responsibility for the dwelling, whether through a joint tenancy, joint mortgage, or equivalent shared financial arrangement rather than as independent occupants making separate contributions to a shared property e.g. flat mates.

Changes to household composition, including the addition or removal of members, will be recognised at the next annual renewal date. The club will consider exceptions to this policy on a case-by-case basis at its discretion, particularly where there are significant changes in personal circumstances.

A junior member who reaches the age of 19 during a membership year will retain their household membership entitlement until the end of that membership year. At the next renewal, they will be offered an individual membership at the applicable rate.

The club may, at its discretion, request evidence of shared primary residence such as rates notices, utility bill, or tenancy agreement to confirm eligibility for a household membership. This right will be exercised reasonably and applied consistently
